Dear Friends,

Back in February, I was invited to a Leading Edge Conference in Phoenix, Arizona that was made up of the largest United Methodist Churches in the country. The time was so inspirational to me. I had an opportunity to visit with Adam

Hamilton, a well-known author and the founder of the largest United Methodist Church in the nation. I was inspired by Hamilton and others, and I came away believing that God is calling our church to a special season of growth.

Have you heard the phrase "you're either growing or you're dying?" I've found it to be true. It's true physically, it's true intellectually, it's true relationally, and it's also true spiritually. All living things are either being tended and growing toward maturity, or they are decaying. We were reminded of this truth this past Sunday in our gospel lesson. Jesus said to his disciples, "I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers" (John 15:5-6). So, as followers of Jesus, we are meant to grow. But, as a church, how can we welcome or prepare for such growth? Enter "Project Grow."

Project Grow is an initiative put forward by church leadership to identify opportunities and make plans that allow for growth. On Monday, April 15, the Church Council met in what one member said was "the best church council meeting ever." We focused the entire meeting on Project Grow and on the future. We identified ten initial areas of opportunity. You will find in this special edition

of the Witness a list of these new projects and initiatives. Some of these items are still in the visioning stages. Some are actionable right now. But this is only the beginning of these plans, and we will all be working together modifying and expanding these plans to grow. It's very exciting!

In this work, it is important to remember that the only way for us to grow as individuals and as a church is to stay in Jesus. Project Grow is just a trellis not the vine. Jesus is the vine. And the new life that we long for can only come from God, the vine grower. We can pray and make plans and apply ourselves, but God gives the growth. So, I hope you will join our leaders in prayer as we discern how God is calling us to grow in this new season.

I am really excited about what is happening at First Church and Project Grow. There's a lot to look forward to. We are already seeing some fruit. We are almost to the 50 new members in the Great Fifty Days of Easter, for which we have been praying. And I believe we are in a unique position in our community to welcome those who are unchurched and need to know the love of Christ. We need all of our members to help welcome newcomers into the life of our church. And it'll take all of us to be the trellis that supports new growth and new life. Let's believe in God's promise! And let's grow together in the name of Jesus!

At First Church, we have been witnessing an exhilarating phase of renewal and growth. And we believe it is now time to embrace God's call to concentrate on our fundamental mission of "making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." Our leadership is inspired, envisioning a future where our average weekly worship attendance reaches 1,000 by the year 2030, and our community is transformed by the love of Christ.

Moreover, we are committed to deepening our discipleship through deliberate educational and spiritual formation efforts that extend into the community, exemplifying hospitality, mercy, and justice. This commitment not only nurtures our congregation but also leaves a lasting impact on the world around us.

Through an exciting new initiative called Project Grow, that Pastor Geoffrey introduced in his Pastor's Letter, the church has identified 10 initial areas of opportunity for growth, and these are laid out below and on the following pages. Key initiatives such as Community Outreach the Great Fifty Day Challenge and the formal establishment of a Pathways to Discipleship program will play pivotal roles in this endeavor.





"DO UNTO OTHERS" CAMPAIGN

Promoting Kindness and Unity in a Divisive Season

During this period of division in American society, amplified by the ongoing 2024 election season, we are aligning with a grassroots movement initiated by the Church of the Resurrection United Methodist in Kansas City, under the leadership of Pastor Adam Hamilton, to embark on a kindness campaign. Centered around the timeless principle of Jesus' Golden Rule, "Do unto others," this initiative offers a direct, impactful response to prevailing cultural tensions through the transformative message of Jesus Christ. BEULAH CHAPEL OF FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

Planting New Churches

The Beulah community is one of the fastest-growing areas in the panhandle, and it presently lacks a United Methodist Church presence. We are being called to consider establishing a satellite worship site in this budding region. This initiative represents our commitment to meeting the spiritual needs of expanding communities. Beulah Chapel will be shepherded by the Rev. Brandon Bures and services will likely begin in small established meeting places with a goal of eventually having our own building in the new planned downtown development. We are proposing the establishment of a church adorned in classic white siding with Craftsman-style architecture, and are even entertaining the possibility of relocating a historic church built in that style to the area

CATHEDRAL FUND

Setting Up for Financial Stability

To fortify the church's Permanent Endowment, we are establishing the Cathedral Fund. This fund is intended to support our historic church building by covering non-budgeted repair costs through the use of interest generated by the fund. The Weatherford Estate will provide the foundational gift to initiate this fund.








BUILDING PROJECT

Making Room for New Growth

The Long-Range Planning Committee has identified several priorities essential for our future growth. A primary focus is the addition of more restrooms at the Sanctuary level to accommodate larger crowds. This suggests the relocation of some ministry offices to facilitate this. A suite of offices is currently being planned in the basement of the Main Sanctuary. Furthermore, there's an ongoing investigation into the requirements for bringing the upstairs of Wesley Abbey up to code. This would enable one of our largest spaces on campus to accommodate the ICON service in the future, aligning with our goals for community engagement and worship expansion.

THRIFT STORE

Supporting Missions with Secondhand and Vintage Items

When envisioning the future use of some of our unused spaces, we were inspired by ministry models from other United Methodist Churches within our conference. The concept of a Thrift Store dedicated to missions caught our attention. Our Outreach Building will be the home to this new initiative. We are currently making minimal repairs to the building and preparing to repurpose it for impactful ministry. We will begin taking donations later this summer and plan to open in the fall. RESPITE MINISTRY

Community Support for Memory Loss Diseases

We recognized that there is a need in our community for a program that supports individuals and families affected by memory loss diseases such as Alzheimer's, dementia, Parkinson's, or stroke. And we aim to launch a Respite Ministry to serve these families. Inspired by and modeled after the successful program at the First United Methodist Church of Montgomery, AL, this ministry will provide much-needed respite for participants and their caregivers. The program is based on a social, self-sustaining model for ministry.





METHODIST CHILDREN'S ACADEMY - EAST HILL

Providing Quality Childcare to a Community in Need

Escambia County is currently facing a childcare crisis. Families are finding it difficult to find childcare and the waitlists are very long. In our ongoing efforts to bolster our school, we are investigating opportunities for expansion both on our current campus and at additional locations. Currently First United Methodist of Pensacola and its Methodist Children's Academy is beginning a new partnership in ministry with St. Mark UMC. Our MCA will be taking over management of their preschool and together we will share the love of God, grow disciples, and provide a loving, safe, nurturing environment for the children of Pensacola.





STAFF CHANGES

Building A Team to Support Growth

To realize our ambitious objectives for growth, we're implementing several critical staff changes.

- 1. **Teaching Pastor:** Rev. Brandon Bures will play a pivotal role in driving church growth, particularly through the ICON service and our exploration in Beulah. He will also oversee Pastoral Care and Membership Development, ensuring our congregation is nurtured and expanded thoughtfully.
- 2. Executive Pastor: Rev. Emily Kincaid will oversee the administration of ministry and operations within the church, as well as manage our staff. Her role will include continuing supervision of the discipleship ministries, including our comprehensive age-level ministries.
- **3. Church Administrator:** Denise Van Atta assumed the role of Church Administrator in January and will lead the operational and project management aspects of the church, streamlining processes and enhancing efficiency.
- **4. Youth Director:** We are nearing the conclusion of our hiring process for a new Youth Director. Our goal is to complete interviews soon and make an announcement before the summer break, ensuring a vibrant leader for our youth ministry.
- **5. Director of Finance:** Holly Houghton has been appointed to head our finance office, where she will manage the church's financial strategies and operations.
- **6. Assistant Director of Finance:** Jennifer Richardson has joined us as the Assistant Director of Finance, supporting our financial management and operations.
- 7. **Respite Director:** We are beginning the search for a director to launch our new Respite Program, aiming to provide crucial support for families dealing with dementia and Alzheimer's.
- **8. Thrift Store Director:** Our search will soon commence for a dedicated leader to helm our mission-focused Thrift Store, turning it into a cornerstone of our outreach efforts.

On Pentecost Sunday, we remember the day the disciples received the Holy Spirit in a special way. The story in Acts 2 describes a powerful wind and tongues of fire as the Holy Spirit was poured out on people from all over the world who came to Jerusalem to celebrate a Jewish feast. At the first Pentecost over 3000 people were baptized, creating the first church. This is why Pentecost is known as the birthday of the Christian church.

The word Pentecost comes from a Greek word meaning fiftieth. The Jewish Festival of Pentecost (called Shavuot, meaning "weeks" in Hebrew) falls on the fiftieth day after the original Passover. On that day, God gave the Torah to Moses on Mount Sinai. The Christian festival of Pentecost falls on the 50th day after the resurrection of Jesus.

Pentecost for Christians culminates the celebration and work of the church begun on Easter Day. In much of early Christianity, Easter Day (not Pentecost) became the primary day for baptisms. After their baptism, the newly baptized were then trained in basic Christian doctrine, including the meaning of the sacraments they had now experienced, as they prepared to take up their ministries in the life of the church. On Pentecost, Christians primarily celebrate the commissioning of new members into ministry. Some do this through services of confirmation on Pentecost. And still others have also, historically, offered baptism on Pentecost as well.

Two colors are historically associated with Pentecost. Red is a visual reminder of the "tongues of fire" that empowered the apostles and others to proclaim the good news of Christ's resurrection in many languages to the crowds of pilgrims from many lands (Acts 2:3). White was used in some places, including England, where Pentecost had also become a day for baptisms by the Middle Ages. Whether it happened at Easter or Pentecost or at some other time, those being baptized were given new white robes to wear as a sign they had taken off the world, died to sin, and were raised with the risen Christ to new life. This is why Pentecost may also be referred to in English as "Whitsunday" or "White Sunday."

The Season after Pentecost is the time of the church year to support new disciples and the whole congregation in living out the gifts we have been given in the name of Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit.
