





Dear Friends,

Advent has a way of sneaking up on us. One minute it's pumpkins and leftover turkey, and the next minute the lights are out of the attic, the playlists have turned to carols, and we're trying to remember where we stored the

Nativity set last year. In the middle of all that, the church quietly reminds us: this season is about Christ.

Caryll Houselander once wrote,

“Advent is the season of the secret,
the secret of the growth of Christ,
of Divine Love growing in silence.”

I love that. Advent is the “season of the secret” — Christ growing in our midst, often unnoticed, beneath all the noise and busyness of December. Our traditions, at their best, are like little parables that help that secret come to light.

This year in worship, our series “Traditions: Practices That Point Us to Christ” will focus on four beloved customs: St. Nicholas, the Christmas tree, stockings, and Nativity crèches. Each of these is more than decoration or nostalgia; each one points us back to Jesus. My hope is that this Advent, we won't just rush past these traditions, but let them preach to us.

When you see St. Nicholas, remember the generosity of Christ. When you plug in the tree, offer a simple prayer: *“Jesus, Light of the world, shine in us.”*

When you hang the stockings, give thanks for God's surprising grace.

When you pass the crèche, pause for a moment and say, *“Thank you, Lord, for coming so near.”*

If we let him, Christ will use even the simplest customs to awaken our hearts, deepen our hope, and make room in us for his coming. That is what Advent is all about: Christ growing in us and among us, quietly, faithfully, until the light of Christmas dawns.

I am grateful to share these traditions with you, and even more grateful for the One they point to. Come, let's walk through this holy season together and rediscover its “secret” — Jesus Christ, Divine Love in our midst.

ADVENT

• AT FIRST CHURCH •

The season of Advent, which comes from the Latin word *adventus* meaning coming or visit, begins four Sundays before Christmas and ends on Christmas Eve. Advent is the beginning of the liturgical year for Christians.

During Advent, we prepare for, and anticipate, the coming of Christ. We remember the longing of Jews for a Messiah and our own longing for, and need of, forgiveness, salvation, and a new beginning. Even as we look back and celebrate the birth of Jesus in a humble stable in Bethlehem, we also look forward, anticipating the second coming of Christ as the fulfillment of all that was promised by his first coming.

The Christmas season begins at sundown on December 24 (Christmas Eve) and lasts until Epiphany of the Lord (January 6). This period is popularly referred to as the twelve days of Christmas.

December 14: Stockings

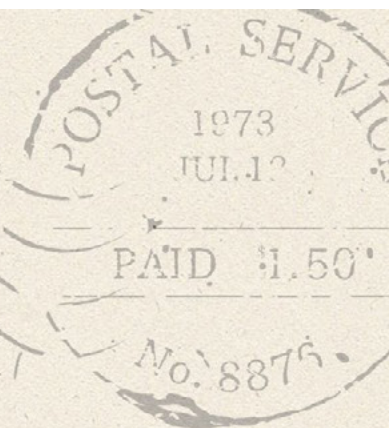
