Dear Friends,

Happy New Year! Today we step into **Founders' Year 2026—All of us, sent again.** I can think of no better way to begin than with Jesus' own words to his followers: he gathers us and he sends us (Luke 9–10). He gives power and

authority for good, tells us to travel light, to lead with peace, and to say wherever we go, "The kingdom of God has come near to you." That is our calling in 2026. That is our identity.

This year is a holy hinge for First Church. In 1821, the Rev. Dr. Alexander Talley was sent to plant a Methodist mission in Pensacola. We are his heirs, but more than that, we are his partners across time. We are not curators of a museum; we are stewards of a mission. Our buildings are beautiful and our history is long, but the point has never been a monument; the point has always been movement—people formed in worship and sent in love.

In just days we will relaunch **ICON** in the Upper Room of the Consulate. Yes, the room is stunning—star-map ceiling, new windows (half of them are installed, the rest will be complete by Easter), and all the tools we need to proclaim the gospel clearly—but the real beauty will be lives awakened to Christ and sent to serve in his name. Later this year, we will open the **Beulah Chapel** campus with worship and preschool, planting a community of prayer, learning, and welcome in a growing part of our region. These are not projects for their own sake. They are instruments of blessing, ways we say to our neighbors with our words and with our lives, "Peace to this house... the kingdom of God has come near."

I want to begin this year with a confession and a commitment. The confession: last fall, when I looked at the scope of this vision,

doubts tried to crowd in—Will it work? Will people come? Do we have enough? The Spirit interrupted me with a simple question: "**Did I send you, or not?**" If the Lord sends, he also supplies. That is enough for me. Which leads to my commitment: I am all in. I am praying, giving, inviting, and serving with fresh courage this year. I believe God is doing something beautiful among us for the sake of Pensacola.

So how do we live this together? We start close to home. We worship faithfully, receive Holy Communion gratefully, and let Scripture set our pace. We make room in our pews, at our tables, and in our schedules. We carry Christ's peace into our daily rounds—classrooms and clinics, jobsites and offices, ball fields and coffee shops. We bless before we argue. We listen before we speak. We trust that the same Spirit who sent the Twelve and the seventy-two is sending us—women and men, younger and older, every gift needed for the work.

I believe the 1821 mission is alive in 2026. I believe Jesus intends to go to places in our city where pain and isolation have lingered, and that he is sending us ahead to prepare the way. I believe Pensacola will see and hear good news through the witness of this church. And I believe you have a part that only you can play. Happy New Year, First Church. Let's walk into it together—with courage, with joy, and with the blessing of the Lord on our lips. **All of us, sent again.**

## TRADITION RICH • MODERN WORSHIP

For nearly seventeen years, ICON has been an important part of the worshiping life of the First United Methodist Church of Pensacola. It has helped shape who we are as a congregation and how we welcome people into a life of faith rooted in tradition and engaged with the present.

On **Sunday, January 11 at 11:00am**, ICON begins a new season as it **relaunches in its new home, the Upper Room**. This move is more than a change of location. It is a renewal—an opportunity to recommit ourselves to worship that is both historic and alive today, and to share that worship with others who may be seeking a place to belong.

ICON follows the ancient pattern of Christian worship through Scripture, prayer, proclamation, and Holy Communion, while music and visual elements reflect contemporary expression. For many, ICON has been a place where liturgy feels accessible, questions are welcomed, and faith is deepened through community and shared participation.

The Upper Room is designed for this kind of worship. Surrounded by stained-glass windows and gathered beneath a star-filled ceiling, worshipers enter a space shaped by beauty, symbolism, and light—inviting reverence, reflection, and shared praise. It is a space created to serve both a beloved worshiping community and those who may be stepping into this kind of worship for the first time.

January 11 is a meaningful moment for our entire church. For those who regularly worship at ICON, this is a long-awaited homecoming—your presence helps set the tone for worship and welcome. For others across our congregation, this relaunch is an opportunity to support ICON by inviting friends, praying for those who will attend, and helping ensure that guests and seekers have room to experience the service in a way that feels open and unhurried.

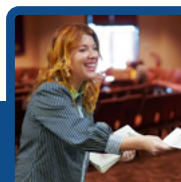
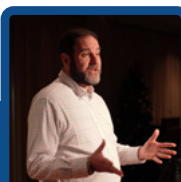

Guests will enjoy a three-course meal while our “classic” acts take the stage in full costume, performing favorite hits from the 50s, 60s, 70s, and 80s. With live music, laughter, and nostalgia throughout the night, Night of the Classics is a wonderful date night or friends’ night out—all while supporting the Church in Tanzania. All proceeds from the evening benefit our congregation’s mission partnership with Nyegezi UMC in Tanzania, supporting vital ministry and future mission trips to the region.

## TEAMING WITH TANZANIA

Since 2018, First Church has been building a strong partnership with Nyegezi UMC in Mwanza, Tanzania. Over the past five years, we’ve taken five teams: two exploratory trips in 2018 and 2019, and three children’s ministry workshops that brought leaders together from across the country. Alongside those efforts, we’ve laid groundwork for future medical missions and clergy training, strengthening ties between our congregations and the broader United Methodist connection.

Looking ahead:

- In February 2026, Bishop L. Jonathan Holston will travel to Tanzania.
- In April 2026, we’ll send another First Church team to continue education training.
- A third clergy training and medical mission is also being planned for November 2026.

This year’s fundraiser has a focused goal: helping Nyegezi UMC resume their nursery school, which brings children and families into the life of the church. The congregation has begun a three-phase construction project to make the needed upgrades, and our fundraising goal is \$8,500 to support this effort. Any funds raised beyond that will go directly toward future trips and mission projects in the Mwanza region.

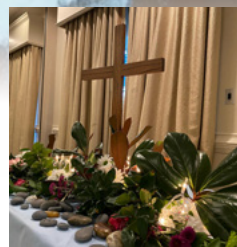

John Wesley believed that to be formed as a disciple, as a follower of Jesus, you need the large community (the church). But where the real Christian formation happened was in the small groups of the class meetings and then even smaller groups of about 5 people.*
