COURSE SYLLABUS

TEXT:

Geoffrey Lentz, Bold to Say: Learning & Living the Lord's Prayer

OBJECTIVE:

Together we will explore the Lord's Prayer as both a guide to faith and a radical call to discipleship. Using *Bold to Say* as our primary text, each week we will dive into a different petition of the prayer, engaging Scripture, history, and theology in order to discover how this prayer can transform our daily lives and our church.

SCHEDULE:

August 20 - "Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name"

Reading: Chapter 1, Matthew 6:9; Romans 8:15

Topic: What does it mean to call God "Father?" How does the Lord's Prayer shape our identity as God's children?

August 27 - "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven"

Reading: Chapter 2, Matthew 6:10; Luke 4:16-21

Topic: The kingdom is not an abstract hope, but a present reality. We'll explore how Jesus' prayer calls us to embody God's reign here and now.

September 3 - "Give us this day our daily bread"

Reading: Chapter 3, Matthew 6:11; Exodus 16:1–30

Topic: Trust, dependence, and God's provision—how the prayer shapes our understanding of abundance and generosity.

September 10 - "Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us"

Reading: Chapter 4, Matthew 6:12; Luke 15

Topic: Forgiveness as the heart of the Gospel and the challenge of extending grace to others.

September 17 - "Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil"

Reading: Chapter 5, Matthew 6:13; James 1:12–18

Topic: Wrestling with temptation, sin, and God's power to deliver.

September 24 - "Thine is the kingdom... & Amen (combined)"

Reading: Chapters 6-7, Matthew 6:13 (doxology), 2 Corinthians 1:20

Topic: The prayer's climax: giving glory to God and sealing it with a bold "Amen."
