

#### **ALL OF US, SENT AGAIN**



Dear Friends,

I'm thrilled for Consecration Sunday on November 9, the day we bring our Estimate of Giving for 2026 as an act of worship. This isn't just a budget moment; it's a mission moment. In Luke 9 and 10, Jesus gathers his people and sends them—first the Twelve, then the seventy-two—telling them to travel light, lead with peace,

and announce, "The kingdom of God has come near." That is our heartbeat for Founders' Year 2026: All of us, sent again. We are not a monument; we are a mission.

For more than two centuries, God has used First Church to bless Pensacola. In 1821, Alexander Talley was sent to start a Methodist mission here. In 2026, we step into that same stream. Your commitment on Consecration Sunday fuels a year of concrete, Gospel-shaped sending. In January, we will relaunch ICON in the Upper Room—an intentionally beautiful space designed not to impress but to form and send disciples. In August, we will open the Beulah Chapel campus with worship and preschool—founding work for a growing community that needs welcome, teaching, and hope. And throughout the year, right here on our downtown campus, we will keep doing what sent people do: proclaim good news, embody mercy, and bless our neighbors in Iesus' name.

Between now and November 9, I'm asking you to pray. Ask the Lord, "What would you have me give so that others will hear and see the good news?" Make a thoughtful, faith-stretched plan for your 2026 giving. On Consecration Sunday we will come forward together and place our estimates on the altar as a sign that our whole lives belong to God.

I'm excited to invest in what God is doing at First Church. I'm all in. I believe 2026 will be one of the most important years in our history—a refounding year that remembers who we are: disciples who are sent. Pensacola will not be reached by condemnation shouted from a distance but by people who carry Christ's peace into homes, schools, offices, ball fields, and coffee shops. That's us. That's our calling. And our shared commitment will make it possible.

Let's step forward together on November 9. All of us, sent again.


#### BE A SANTA TO A SENIOR

We love the traditions that help us get ready for Christmas; the lights, the tree, the carols, the Nativity. But these practices are more than holiday customs. In Advent, they point us toward something deeper: the coming of Christ. Advent is a season of preparation — a time to awaken our hearts, to wait with hope, and to make room for the child who changes everything. Each week in this series, Traditions: Practices That Point Us to Christ, we'll explore a beloved Christmas tradition alongside Scripture, discovering how it prepares us not just for December 25, but for the living presence of Jesus in our lives. Come join us as we rediscover the meaning behind the practices we cherish, and let them guide us into the wonder of Christ's birth.

#### Advent 1: St Nicholas

Sunday, November 30 | Matthew 24:36 - 44

Jesus tells us the Son of Man will come like a thief in the night — suddenly, unexpectedly. Not to steal, but to bless. St. Nicholas was known for slipping secretly into homes, surprising people with gifts of generosity. This Advent, we are called to live ready for Christ's coming, watching for the blessings he brings.

#### **Advent 2: Christmas Trees**

Sunday, December 7 | Matthew 3:1 - 12

John the Baptist warns that the ax is already at the root of the trees — what is rotten must be cut down to make way for new life. St. Boniface felled the sacred oak and lifted up the evergreen as a sign of eternal life in Christ. Advent calls us to prune away what does not bear fruit, so that Christ's life may grow strong in us.

#### **Advent 3: Stockings**

Sunday, December 14 | Matthew 11:2 - 11

John the Baptist, waiting in prison, longs to know if Jesus is the one to come. Waiting is never easy. Our Christmas stockings hang empty, waiting to be filled with good things. In the same way, Advent invites us to wait with expectation — trusting that Christ will come and fill our lives with his joy and presence.

#### Advent 4 - Nativity Scenes

Sunday, December 21 | Matthew 1:18 - 25

An angel tells Joseph that the child to be born is Emmanuel, "God with us." To help people see this truth, St. Francis of Assisi created the first crèche, setting the story of Christ's birth before the eyes of the faithful. The Nativity reminds us that God chose to dwell among us, not far away, but right here — in a child laid in a manger.

#### **WHO WE ARE**

#### Providing ministry from the heart: Embrace Florida Kids offers joy-filled childhoods.

It's not uncommon for young adults who have found hope and healing through Embrace Florida Kids' ministry to credit the agency for changing their lives. "They provided me with a home, a family, stability, an education and lifelong relationships. It means everything to me," one resident said. "It's my home; it's a part of me," said another.

But when you ask them years later what made the greatest impact on their lives, they don't usually focus on those big services. Instead, they talk about the love they received

and the opportunities they were given to cast aside their adult-sized worries and enjoy their childhoods.

At Embrace Florida Kids, those opportunities are known as cotton candy. After all, you find the sugary confection that melts in your mouth at places where kids have fun - baseball games, football games, amusement parks and the circus. Since most of the children and teenagers served by the ministry haven't had much fun in their lives, the staff does everything possible to provide ordinary moments of happiness that many people take for granted.

The work of Embrace Florida Kids is critical. The ministry provides children and youth who have suffered from abuse and neglect with a safe home. They receive warm beds, nutritious meals, a spiritual foundation, an education, and everything they need to heal physically, emotionally and mentally. Embrace Florida Kids is a nonprofit, faith-based organization dedicated to serving vulnerable children and families across Northwest Florida. With the mission to embrace children with unconditional love and surround them with the support they need to thrive, Embrace offers residential and group homes for children, teens, college students, teen moms, and homeless mothers and their children. It also supports families in crisis through family preservation, partners with caring foster families and equips parents with resources to prepare their children for school success.

At Embrace Florida Kids, cotton candy comes in the form of trips, dance lessons and other extracurricular activities. The kids play football and basketball. They're cheerleaders and softball players; they're in the band. They go to the beach and the lake; they go to Disney World. They participate in mission trips. They attend church, summer camp and the prom. They roast marshmallows, play Ping-Pong and splash in the rain.

"There are many programs out there that help children, but ours is truly a ministry," said Ramsey Lawrence, director of development and community relations. "We go above and beyond because they are worth it. Our kids receive counseling if they need it, and most of them do. Our staff and foster parents laugh with them, cry with them and offer lots of hugs. We want them to know they aren't alone, they have value, and they are worthy of love."

The result is transformational. "I never in my life dreamed I would get to do some of the things I've done," said one group home resident. "Most of us come from pretty difficult circumstances, but once I came here, I was able to forget all that. Here, I feel loved and cared for."
