

Teaming with TANZANIA

God is moving in Tanzania!

The United Methodist Church is growing more in Africa than anywhere else in the world! Since 2018, our Alabama-West Florida Conference has been in partnership with the Tanzania Annual Conference to support the church's growth in the Mwanza region. Mwanza is located on the southern shore of Lake Victoria and is the second largest city in Tanzania. Districts and churches around our conference have



helped to construct several church buildings for new United Methodist congregations all around Mwanza and we have sent several teams to the area to

support the growing churches and the local Wesley College.

This April, a team of nine missionaries (eight from our congregation and one from Ashland Place UMC in Mobile) represented the Alabama-West Florida Conference in Tanzania with the goal of supporting the growing United Methodist Church in ministry while also building relationships and gathering information for future mission projects.

The team's main purpose was to support and help grow children's ministries in local congregations. This took the form of a Children's Ministry workshop led by Lisa Bond and Denise VanAtta and assisted by Lee Ann Boykin, Patrick Houghton, and Holly Houghton. This workshop was held at Nyasaka UMC in Mwanza and was attended by representatives from each of the 12 districts in Tanzania. There were around 30 participants in all. We spent three days in the workshop teaching about the importance of children's ministry. We shared stories, played games, shared

programming ideas, and discussed ways to pray. Everyone was eager to learn and take these lessons back to their congregations to share. At the end, we commissioned our



new friends for children's ministry in their local churches. It was a beautiful closing. The team along with the local Mwanza District Superintendent and Pastor Geoffrey gave stoles to and prayed over each participant, and the participants prayed one for another. We gifted them children's Bibles in Swahili and they in turn honored our team with their own gifts and singing. It was a holy moment in a holy place, and God's hand was undoubtedly on the work. Our team was so grateful to be allowed to play a part in that moment.



In addition to the workshop, the team also assisted at the local Wesley College. Wesley College is a United Methodist institution in the heart of Mwanza. It

is a new educational venture that is being built from the ground up, not looking at traditional education models, but the specific educational needs in Tanzania and what type of higher education institute would have the ability to address those educational needs. The school's foundation is its Theology program, and Pastor Geoffrey was able to teach a class on the History of Methodism to some of the Theology students there. In addition to Theology, the college offers many other programs in which they use experiential, project-based learning to help prepare students to be job ready professionals. Our own Kathy Worley met with all the girls at Wesley College to discuss the beginnings of a program aimed at women's empowerment - a much-needed and often foreign concept to women in their culture.

As if that weren't enough, the team also had meetings and discussed plans for a future dental mission to some

of the areas around Mwanza most in need. Dr. Laura McAuley and Pastor Geoffrey met with local health authorities and clinics as well as local leaders to discuss the



possibility of offering free dental clinics to the community. There is great need for dental work and other health care and there will be great interest whenever a team returns. We hope to send a team of dentists in the next year.

On Sunday, we finished our trip worshiping God with our Tanzanian brothers and sisters. It's a beautiful thing to be a part of. Their worship seems so heartfelt and genuine and their faith is something to strive for. *Continuned on Page 9.* The team worshiped and Pastor Geoffrey preached first at City Center UMC that meets inside Wesley College.



After that we were able to travel and join our friends at our sister church Nyegezi UMC, (First Church donated the money to build Nyegezi in 2018). At

Nyegezi we received the most beautiful welcome. As we approached the hilltop where the church was built there was a crowd waiting and singing, welcoming us back to their community. They sang us from our vehicles, up the hill, and to the church's doors. It was amazing! Inside we worshiped, heard the children's choir, shared a meal together, held meetings, and visited. Outside, we played games with the children and walked down the road to look at a spot for the Pensacola Nursery School they are naming in our honor. We left feeling grateful for the relationships we made and the friends that we saw and truly blessed and humbled that we got to be a small part of God's great work in this African community. Thanks be to God.

This trip would not have been possible without the support of our congregation. Because of your generosity

we were able to raise over \$8,000 through the Night of the Classics fundraiser, the Tanzania Tea, the Holy Week Concert, and other collections. This money paid for the workshop and allowed us to provide transportation, lodging, and food, to all the workshop participants. It supported the team's translators and transportation, allowed for a \$1200 gift to start the Pensacola Nursery School at Nyegezi, and much more. Each one that gave was an integral part of the team. Thank you for giving to the mission of the church. And thanks to Ashland Place UMC for providing the Story Book Bibles and the stoles for the workshop.

Our conference's partnership with Tanzania grows stronger each year. And our team can testify that God is truly

working there. Great things are happening and greater things are still to be done. We will continue to pray that we can be good partners in this mission. *If you are interested in being a*
