

Our partnership with Teaming with Tanzania continues. Since 2018, we have sent three teams - one with Bishop Graves, one to train children's ministries leaders and one to support Wesley College. In 2019, the children of VBS, along with a special program, a Night of the Classics, helped raise money to kick off a campaign to build a church. In Tanzania. FUMC raised enough money to build Nyegezi UMC and continue to partner with our new sister church. In April 2023, we will send three more teams to teach at Wesley College, to continue training Children's Ministries leaders and to offer dental services. In

order to continue this ministry, we will need to raise approximately \$13,000. Our plan is to offer 2-3 events to raise this money: a Tanzania Tea Room in November and February and Night of the Classics in January/February.

October 6-10, we have another exciting opportunity to support and learn more about our partnership with Wesley College. Rev. Bonface Wanyama, Head of Wesley College Theology Department is making his first trip to US and is including us on his itinerary. On Sunday, October 9, he will speak in each service and at a special forum for all classes and individuals held in the Wright Place, Great Hall from 9:45-10:45am. MEET REV. BONFACE WAYAMA



Reverend Bonface Wanyama, Head of the Theology Department at Wesley College, grew up in a small village in Kenya. The saddest moment of his life came at the age of 12, when both of his parents died of HIV-AIDS.

He first lived with relatives, and then he was adopted by a United Methodist pastor and later moved to Nairobi. Reverend Wanyama had grown up Roman Catholic, but his adoptive father greatly influenced his faith journey. He first became active in the church as a youth leader. Then, he began preaching. Ultimately, he traveled to Zimbabwe for divinity training. When he returned to Nairobi after graduation and met United Methodist missionary Eric Soard, he learned about the Tanzanian church's vision for Wesley College. He told Eric, "I'll come whenever you're

ready." He's been part of the college since the first day. Reverend Wanyama has a multi-faceted role at the College. He supervises teachers in the theology department and makes sure that they have the resources they need. He connects students with advisors and he also advises and teaches students himself.

Reverend Wanyama is inspired to be here. "I can confidently say that Wesley College is one of the best things that ever happened to the church here. This is God's own project."

But that doesn't mean that the work has been easy. He recognizes that the educational level is lower in this area than in other countries of the region, and students need more help academically. "We are investing a lot into the students, but it is not just for them. We are here to serve the community. Education cannot be for yourself, but if you can use education to do something, it becomes relevant."

Social Holiness: When [John] Wesley says that holiness is social he means that the depth of your love for God is revealed by the way you love whom God loves. The writer of 1 John describes the social nature of holiness: We love because he first loved us. Those who say, 'I love God', and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also (1John 4:19-21). (No Holiness But Social Holiness, Steve Manskar Discipleship Ministries, The United Methodist Church)

The FUMC JUST Team Members will be mindful of John Wesley's teachings on Social Holiness as they join 18 J.U.S.T. Pensacola (Justice United Seeking Transformation in Pensacola) congregations from 12 different faith traditions in a Community Assembly on November 7.
